  - Cambodia: Oddar Meanchey



## Comparative Analysis of REDD Submissions

- · Start of work on REDD at FC.
- International Discussions/Negotiations under UNFCCC SBSTA (Subsidiary Body for Scientific and Technological Advice), AWG-LCA (Ad-Hoc Working Group on Long-Term Cooperative Action under the Convention)
  - Working Group on Long-Term Cooperative Action under
- Results:
  - Matrix summarizing the way countries addressed the issues (SBSTA 26-28);
  - Directions of international discussions:
    - Difficult methodological issues remain and have been left to be solved at national and bilateral level during the capacity building period
    - Leave the details of indigenous/local communities involvement to national governments
  - Further research needed on designing a monitoring and reporting system efficiently involving communities

## Viet Nam on the REDD stage

- Forest Status
  - Viet Nam is one of the ten countries with the largest annual net gain forest area for 2005 to 2010 (241 000 ha/yr) (FAO's FRA 2005)
  - Decline in natural forest areas of about 6000 ha/yr, despite overall country increase of forested areas (R-PIN)
  - 1995: regenerated forests do not have high carbon stocks and that for recovery these up to a timber volume of above 90 m<sup>3</sup>/ha at least 50 years are needed (R-PIN).
