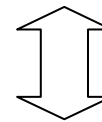
(Essential element of SD and Green Economy)

Enabling conditions and Facilitation by the National Government

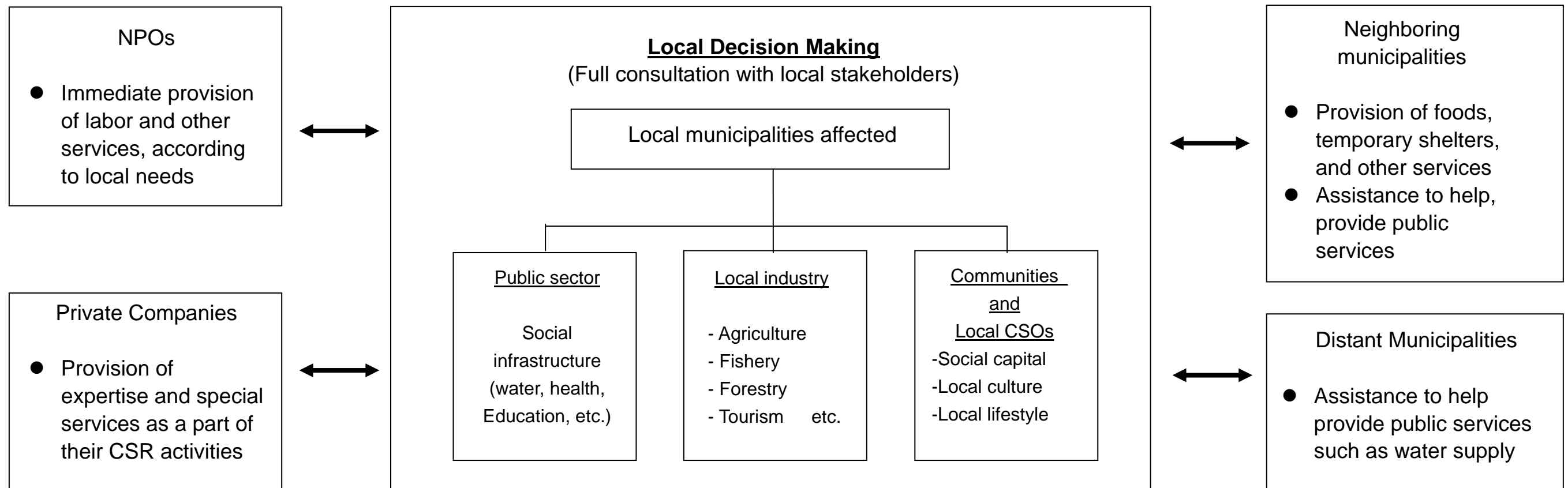
- Provision of resources -- Funds to be provided without strings
- Decentralization of authorities -- Creation of specialized rehabilitation areas
- Realization of Cross-sectoral approaches -- Single designated national agency
- Facilitation of multi-stakeholders collaboration -- Facilitation rather than implementation

(Two way interactions)

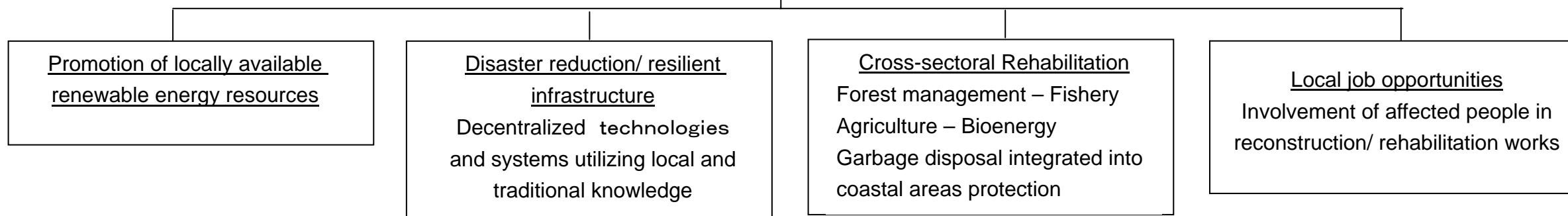

Local employment, Smart use of local natural resources, protection of local communities/ culture

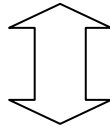


Suggested Framework for Rehabilitation of Fukushima

National Government: New policies for full compensation and long-term support

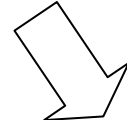
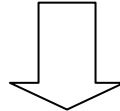
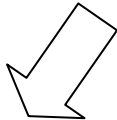
- ✓ Comprehensive and inclusive compensation scheme
- ✓ Full investigation into radiation levels and impacts health, food security, and other related concerns
- ✓ Full information sharing
- ✓ Full technical support

(Sound coordination)



Local municipalities affected: Central role for recovery and rehabilitation

- ✓ Upholding basic local services: local decision making backed by sound communications among local stakeholders, provision of quality services such as health care even during the evacuation period, provision of various supports in temporally integration in other municipalities, and conducting annual local events for keeping linkages among local community members, etc.
- ✓ Supporting local communities and industries in diverse ways: strengthened collaboration with unaffected municipalities within Fukushima prefecture and other municipalities in which affected people take refuge, de-contamination operations and rehabilitation of local communities and industries.



Temporal assistance to those evacuees in other municipalities for better access to job opportunities (short-term)

Improved access to job opportunities, job training, and support for resettlement.

Decontamination operations (medium term)

Soil decontamination, disposal of contaminated garbage, promotion of agricultural practices to reduce contamination, and promotion of locally available renewable energy such as solar and wind, with maximum involvement of local people.

Rehabilitation of local communities and industries (long-term)

Full compensation to lost profits, support for local employment, support for local resettlement, as well as promotion of IT based industries through horizontal integration of SMEs.
