BEYOND RIO+20

Institutions

- Resolved to establish an inclusive and transparent process on <u>SDGs</u>, open to all stakeholders. By 67th GA Session, 2012, constitute open ended WG of 30 members nominated by Member States through the 5 UN Regional groups. Report to be submitted to 68th GA Session. Initial input by UN SG with support by an Inter-agency team and expert panels, as needed.
- Agreed to establish an intergovernmental process on <u>financing</u>, under UNGA. Inter-governmental Committee, 30 experts nominated by regional groups will implement process, concluding work by 2014.
- Decided to establish a universal inter-governmental <u>high-level forum</u>, building upon CSD and subsequently replacing it. 12 ToRs suggested for forum. Launch an inter-governmental and open, transparent and inclusive negotiating process under GA for establishing Forum by 68th UNGA.

"We are committed to strengthening the role of the United Nations Environment Programme (UNEP) as the leading global environmental authority that sets the global environmental agenda, promotes the coherent implementation of the environmental dimension of sustainable development within the United Nations system and serves as an authoritative advocate for the global environment. We reaffirm resolution 2997 (XXVII) of 15 December 1972 which established UNEP and other relevant resolutions that reinforce its mandate, as well as the 1997 Nairobi Declaration on the Role and Mandate of UNEP and the 2000 Malmö Ministerial Declaration. In this regard, we invite the General Assembly, at its sixty-seventh session, to adopt a resolution strengthening and upgrading UNEP in the following

manner: " Para 88 Outcome Document.

CAPACITY BUILDING

"We emphasize the need for **enhanced** capacity-building for sustainable development and, in this regard, we call for the strengthening of technical and scientific cooperation, including North-South, South-South and triangular cooperation. We reiterate the importance of **human resource**

development, including training, the exchange of experiences and expertise, knowledge transfer and technical assistance for capacity-building, which involves strengthening institutional capacity, including planning, management and monitoring capacities." *Para 277 Outcome Document*

educational institutions, especially higher educational institutions in developing countries, to carry out research and innovation for sustainable development, including develop quality and innovative programmes, entrepreneurship, business skills, technical and vocational training geared to bridging skills gaps for advancing national sustainable development objectives---
