

## Why Green Integration?

- > Asia is facing multiple environmental and social challenges
  - Soaring resource consumption
  - Increasing impacts of climate change
  - Growing gaps between rich and poor
- Such challenges are difficult to address by individual countries
  - Countries' economic competition is adding to these difficulties
- > International solutions are needed
  - Potential to strengthen regional collaboration and to make regional integration processes contribute to sustainable development

- > Timely topic
  - New integration initiatives: AEC, TPP, etc.

## Making Integration Greener: A Three-pronged Approach

- ➤ Effective environmental and social safeguards in free-trade agreements
  - Analysis of sustainability impacts
  - Harmonised (minimum) standards
- Capable regional institutions with strong environmental and social mandates
  - Leadership and agenda-setting
  - Research and knowledge sharing
  - Monitoring and assessments
- > Capacity building at national and city levels
  - Especially for effective policy implementation and monitoring
