Opportunities in Bangladesh for JCM

- Rapid economic growth with a huge number of domestic consumers (more than 6% GDP growth over last decade)
- Fast growing multi-dimensional manufacturing industries seeking world leading low carbon technologies, equipments and services
- Consistent political commitments towards achieving low carbon climate resilient development

Challenges and Barriers in promotion of JCM in Bangladesh

- The technical complexity around the concept of carbon crediting systems (PDD, methodology, verification, monitoring, tradability, issuing CERs, etc.)
- Uncertainty in international regime
- Relatively low price of gas and electricity
- Lack of strong match-making functions in establishing viable consortiums
- Lack of establishing effective networks between potential entrepreneurs and the Governments of participating countries

Possible Way Forward

- Major focus should be put on matchmaking functions and maintaining effective networks among stakeholders
- Uncertainty around emission crediting in future international regime should not get prominence
- How to create consortium has to be easily understandable and executable by the entrepreneurs
