Current approaches have not been adequate and effective




Sector-based tools and methods without integration

What is a Nexus Approach?


Oxford Dictionary

- A connection or series of connections linking two or more things.
 - A connected group or series.
- A central or focal point.

Nexus is not an entirely new concept

- Holistic, integrative, and trans-disciplinary thinking
- Mentioned from 1983 (UNU project)
- Bonn Nexus Conference (2011) a breakthrough

Types of Nexus Approaches





Advantages of Urban Nexus Approach



Provide better understanding of the interdependence and interconnectedness of numerous complex systems (water, energy, ecosystem, etc..)



Recognize tensions among sustainability goals, enhance synergies and reduce trade-offs




Strengthen institution and governance and building capacities for integrated planning and implementation









Resource Nexus Conceptual Frameworks

















The Urban Nexus Wheel
