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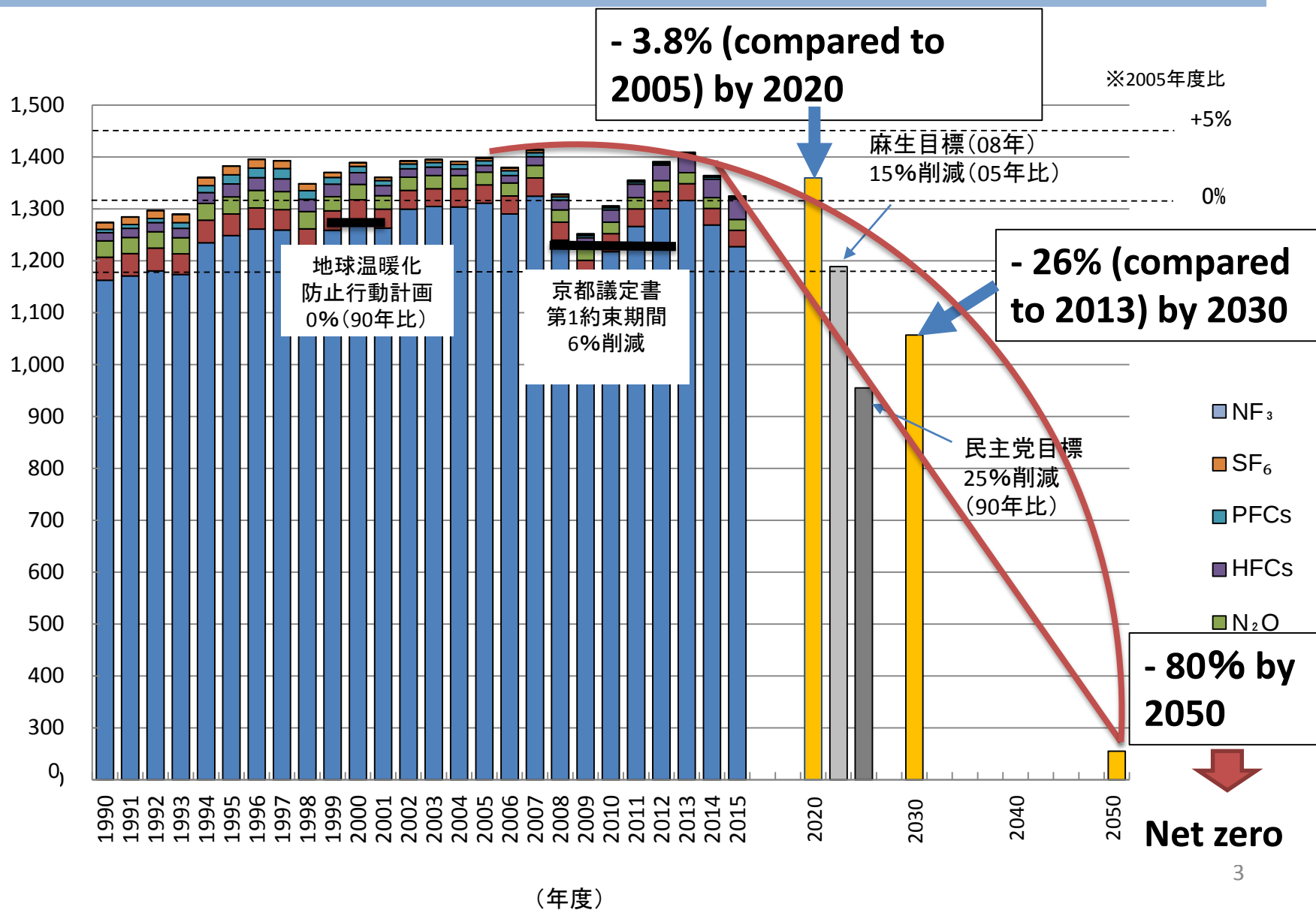

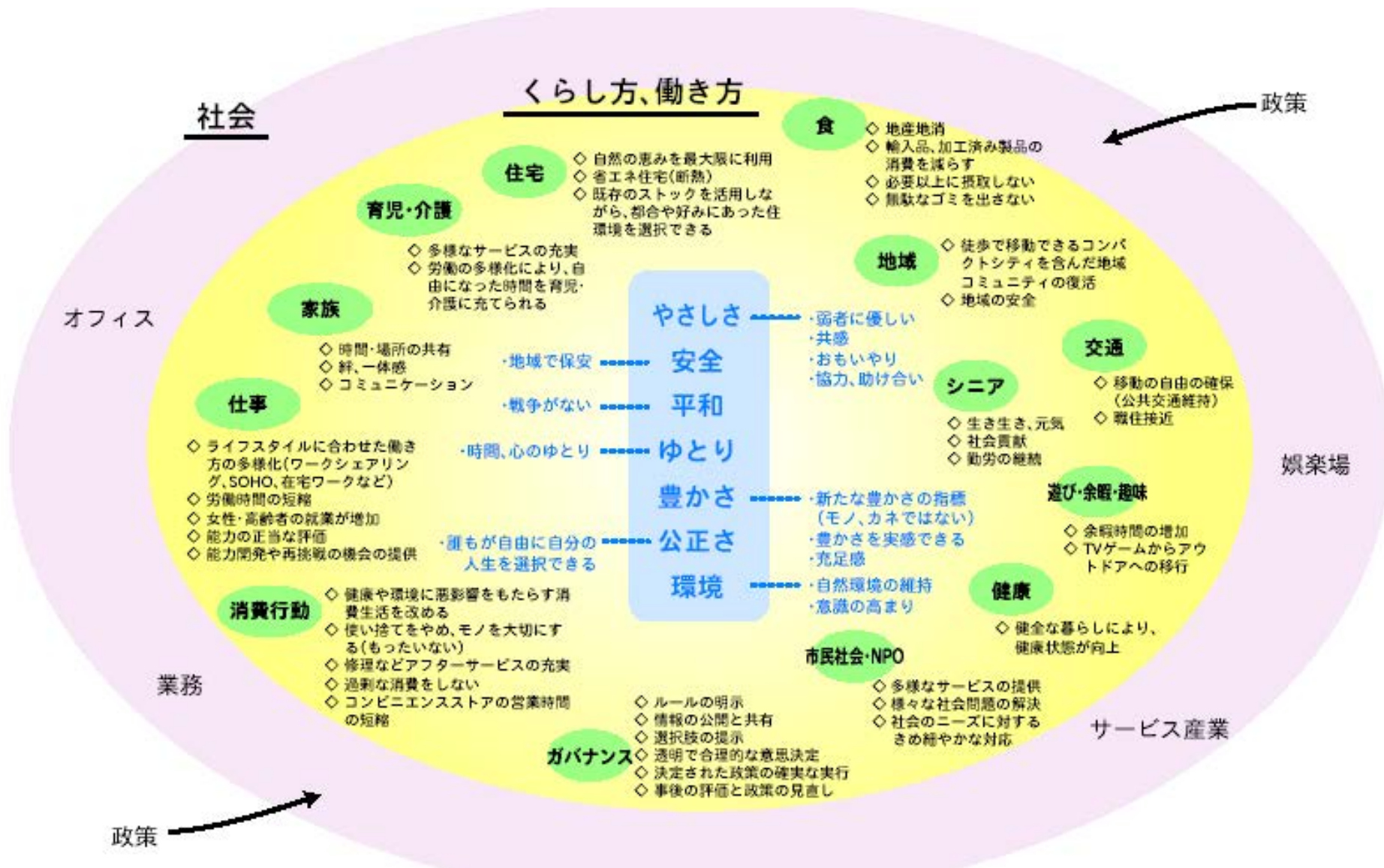
1. Realize an effective international regime that reduces global greenhouse gas emissions to zero

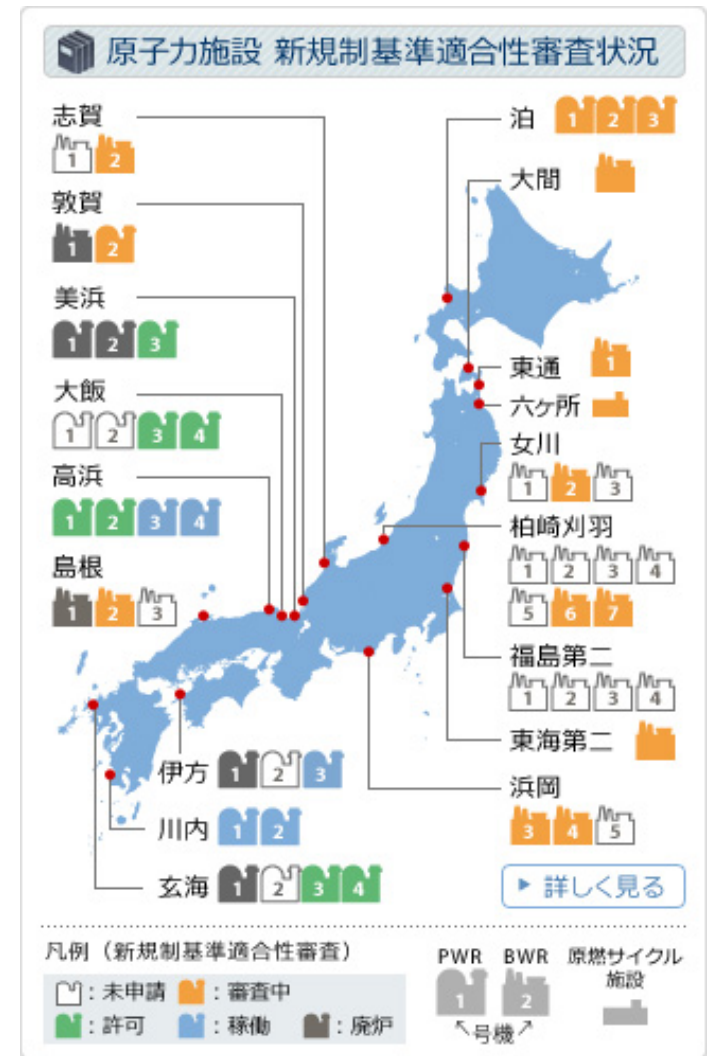


Does the Japanese public really have "dialogue" on our future and technology choices?

Planned new COAL power plants



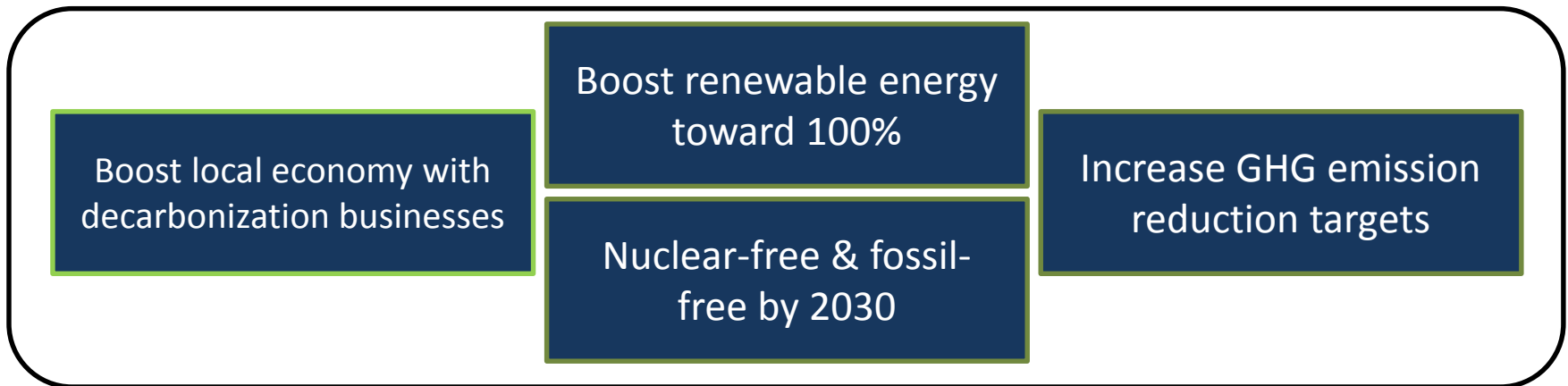
Restarts of NUCLEAR plants
