Talanoa Dialogue and Paris Agreement

Key feature of the Paris Agreement

- Long term goals: 2 degree goal, balance of anthropogenic emission and removal in the second half of 21st century etc.
- > Each country sets its target (NDC) and updates it every 5 years
- Global Stocktake for the long term goal every 5 year (from 2023)
- The outcome of GS informs to each party's update of target.

Decision 1/COP21 paragraph 20

Decide to hold a "facilitative dialogue" in 2018, aiming to:

- take stock of progress toward the long tern goals of the Paris Agreement Article 4
- share information on the status of preparation of each party's NDC_\circ
- At COP21, PA was thought of as the post-2020 regime. Talanoa Dialogue was established as a preparatory work until the PA becomes effective.
- □ PA came into force in 2016 earlier than expected.
- □ TD(2018) as a Test of the Global Stocktake(2023,2028 · ·) or the 1st GS virtually.

□ Input from all parties and non-state actors (until 29 Oct. 2018)
