Regional-CES is a concept to promote sustainable development through applying circularity principles at the local and regional levels with close and equitable collaboration between rural and urban areas for maximum utilisation of local strengths and resources.



MOEJ's Concept of the "Regional Circulating and Ecological Sphere (Regional-CES)"



• Strong focus on the development of rural communities

While "it is impossible for any local socio-economic activities to be entirely self-contained in this modern age of extensive socioeconomics", by applying Regional-CES, regions, including those with rural communities, can demonstrate their "strengths by utilizing its unique characteristics, thereby building a self-reliant and decentralized society [...]".

 Many of the good practices highlighted in MOEJ's concept paper "Creation of a Regional Circular and Ecological Sphere (Regional-CES) to Address Local Challenges" are initiatives from rural regions of Japan. APN/IGES-KRC Joint Scoping Activity on Regional-CES

• Objectives:

- Introduce Regional-CES and investigate its applicability in the unique context of three SEA countries;
- Compare Regional-CES with other frameworks/ concepts; and
- Identify entry points, challenges and possible solutions.
- Conducted three national workshops:
 - Philippines (held virtually in Febr. 2022)
 - Thailand (October 2022)
 - Indonesia (May 2023)

National WS in the Philippines

"Building Climate Resiliency through Linking Rural-Urban Plans and Priorities"



Challenges

- Mismatch in priorities due to confliction of policies at local, sub-national and national levels
- Wasteful duplication of plans from various agencies at various levels
- Lack of knowledge and information sharing

Tackling challenges

- Empowerment of stakeholders
- Strengthening cross-sectoral coordination
- Sharing of knowledge and best practices
- Research and development in circular economy practices

National WS in Thailand

"Promoting Regional-CES: Concept for Resilient and Sustainable Communities"



Challenges

- Weak location-based regulatory tools
- Incompatibility between top-down implementation efforts and local needs
- Lack of understanding of locally available resources

Tackling challenges

- Improvement of laws/regulations based on locations and their specific needs
- Establishment of local stakeholder platforms
- Community participation/consultation to formulate and implement spatial planning

National WS in Indonesia

"Strengthening Urban-Rural Linkage for Localisation of SDGs through Integrated Regional Planning and Collective Actions"



Challenges

- Bias: urban-centric positions stronger than rural interests
- Lack of inter-municipality coordination
- Different culture/tradition between urban and rural areas

Tackling challenges

- Enhancing spatial planning with accurate mapping
 - Effective law enforcement
- Addressing conflicts between land ownership rights and spatial regulations

Take home messages from the National Workshops



- More inclusion of rural communities needed
 - strong emphasis on engagement of other stakeholder groups. However, Regional-CES is still very urban-centric
 - Stronger and more thorough engagement of stakeholders from rural areas is essential
 - Enhancing communication: national development plans without understanding of the needs of rural communities
- Legal infrastructure to be strengthened: land development plan to empower rural communities

Take home messages from the National Workshops



- Regional-CES is not the only concept around as other frameworks/concepts exist and being implemented, e.g.:
 - Bio-circular-green (BCG) Economy in Thailand,
 - Philippine Action Plan for Sustainable Consumption and Production (PAP4SCP)
 - Presidential regulation 60/2020 of Indonesia on urban rural development in Jabodetabekpunjur
 - ⇒ Need to further investigate these concepts, learn from their good practices and experiences
 - ⇒ No perfect fit for all
 - ⇒ Better communication within and between stakeholder groups
